

DRESS CODE and COURSE ETIQUETTE

DRESS CODE:

We respectfully ask players to adopt a smart/casual appearance when using the golf course

Trainers or preferably golf shoes. Strictly no football boots or astro-trainers.

Players must keep their shirt on at all times on all facilities.

PACE OF PLAY:

All players must have their own bag of clubs- NO SHARING SETS

Let faster players through – regardless of number of players or competition play, if the player / players behind you are playing faster you must let them through. Do this by standing to the side and waving your arm to signal the group behind through.

CARE OF COURSE:

Please do your utmost to keep your course in good condition by following these simple rules.

Rake Bunkers

Always enter and leave bunkers by the lowest part of the bank or the point least likely to displace sand. NEVER climb out of the bunker by the steep face.

Repair pitch marks

Take care when removing or replacing the flagstick so as not to damage the hole.

Golf Buggies/Golf Trolleys should not be taken on greens, tees, through bunkers.

HAZARDOUS WEATHER and GROUND CONDITIONS:

Just because the course is open, we do not warrant the course fit or safe to play. Each player should assess their own capabilities with regards to ground conditions.

Lightning:

A decision to carry on playing during adverse weather conditions is left to the discretion of the player, who MUST accept full responsibility for his/her, safety. The Centre, however, strongly recommend you stop play particularly when there is a risk of thunder and lightning in the area.

If you are golfing and there is not sufficient time to evacuate the course, the clubhouse is too far away and there is a threat of lightning, your best protection is to leave your clubs and crouch down in a bunker.

Do not put an umbrella up under any circumstances.

Please note that golf buggies do NOT give protection from lightning.

It is the player's own responsibility to discontinue play when, in his/her opinion, there is a danger from lightning

Fog:

In the event of fog reducing visibility on the course, it is the individual member's responsibility to halt play if they believe that the likely landing place of the ball is not visible from where they are playing their shot.
